- 2. Name one fact, detail, and opinion.

(three or more sentences – label each and include page numbers)

- 3. What happened 1st, 2nd, 3rd, next, after that, and finally? (six or more sentences)
- 4. Tell two things that happened. What was the cause of each? (four or more sentences)
- 5. Based on what has happened so far, what do you think will happen next? (five or more sentences)
- 6. How did the context clues help you find the meaning of two new words? (four or more sentences including the definitions)
- 7. Compare/Contrast what you are reading now to literature you've read/seen before. (five or more sentences)
- 8. What is a conclusion you can make based on what you just read? (five or more sentences)
- 9. Using clues from the text, what are a few things you can infer? (five or more sentences)
- 10. What is the author's purpose for writing what you are reading? (five or more sentences)
- 11. Give three examples of a simile, metaphor, and/or personification.

 (three or more sentences label each and include page numbers)
- 12. Summarize what you are reading in five sentences.

Always be able to support your response by using the text.
